An Act repealing 33 V.I.C., chapter 89, section 2591 relating to the Government of the Virgin Islands authority to assign, sell or transfer real property tax liens

1 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:*

2 SECTION 1. Title 33 Virgin Islands Code, Chapter 89, subchapter V is repealed.

3 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Government of the
4 Virgin Islands may not assign, sell or transfer any tax lien on real property which
5 remains unpaid after the due date.

6 **BILL SUMMARY**

7 This bill, via Section 1, seeks to repeal 33 V.I.C., Chapter 89, subchapter V, which
8 authorizes the Government of the Virgin Islands to assign, sell or transfer any tax lien on
9 real property which remains unpaid after the due date and gives the transferee of the tax
10 liens the same rights, powers and duties as the Lt. Governor to collect the tax, including
11 the collection by attachment a sale of the property Section 2 of the bill seeks to
12 specifically prohibit such actions, notwithstanding any other law to the contrary which
13 may explicitly or implicitly provide such authorization.
